### **MUSICAL MATTERS**

Covid-19 continues to cause issues! As many of you know, our bishop has made the recommendation that congregational singing **not** be a part of our worship services once we are back within our church building. I know that I, along with you, will miss the singing, but please rest assured that music will still have a place within our services. Cynthia and I will continue to work together to bring music to our worship, even if we cannot sing as a group.

Unfortunately, this will most likely not be the only way that our music will be affected. In researching the impact of the virus on choral singing, I have read multiple articles that have been supported by musical organizations like the National Association of Teachers of Singing, and the American Choral Directors Association, that suggest that singers can actually be considered virus "super-spreaders" based on the amount of air and projection required for singing. There is no way to adequately "social distance" within our choir loft, and it is simply not safe for our choir members, or congregation to participate in choral singing at this time.

As you may have guessed, this news completely broke my heart (especially the thought that I will not be able to sing with my young students at school in the fall). I love to sing, and I know that John Wesley (who greatly supported congregational singing) would be disappointed, too. The problem is that we simply don't know what the future holds. There is no way for us to know when a cure will happen, and we don't know how a single song could affect our congregation. I have read horror stories from other choirs and I am determined to keep this from happening to us.

Please be patient as we find our way. Choir might not resume this fall, and a Christmas cantata might not be possible this year, but music will still be around us and within us. I pray that we can soon put all of this behind us and go back to our "old normal" (I really liked that normal – I got to hug people!). Song requests can still be made for songs that Cynthia and I will perform, even if we can't sing them as a worship community!

## TRUSTEES

We finally received news on the cost of the part for the boiler, unfortunately not the news we wanted. The part(s) and labor will be close to \$7,200; but to keep the boiler running and have heat we don't have much choice. The trustees talked and approved the cost and the company was called to get the part ordered. The part may not get here till September, so good thing we called and put on order.

The other item mentioned last month that is remaining is basically an exploratory process. The boiler is leaking but to find out what part is the culprit we have to take the exterior walls of boiler apart. This is labor intensive. However, we have come to the conclusion that we need to at least have this done to find out what parts need replacing. We don't want to leave it undone and find out it was a rather inexpensive fix and we caused more damage to the boiler by not doing it.

We have had some folks think it may be time to get rid of the boiler and go to heat pumps. This solution, right now, is probably not the best idea as it will probably be in the tens of thousands of dollars to do this and the electrical into the building would have to be upgraded as well to handle the new loads.

Not much else to report; but feel this is enough to have to soak in for now.
